The Waved albatross, Galápagos hawks, Magnificent frigate birds, Lava gulls, the iconic Blue-footed Boobies, and countless species of finch seemed to embrace us where ever we went! The Galápagos Islands are a birdwatcher's paradise. Observing these fascinating birds in their natural habitat was an unforgettable experience.
